

Eugenics: Building the Perfect Race with instructor Karl Menninger

Eugenics is a theory that the human race could be improved if positive characteristics (e.g. intelligence, attractiveness) were passed on to the next generations and if undesirable characteristics (e.g. mental disability, inheritable diseases) were eliminated from the gene pool. We'll discuss how it was used in Nazi Germany and also look at its legacy today, with genetic engineering and population control.



George Washington Carver: Scientist and Inventor born into slavery

Shortly after his birth as a slave in southwest Missouri, George Washington Carver, his sister and their young mother were kidnapped by slave raiders. We'll review Carver's successes in developing products from cotton, soybeans, sweet potatoes and peanuts; sharing advanced techniques with struggling farmers; advocating for racial harmony; and visiting Mahatma Gandhi to discuss nutrition developing nations.
